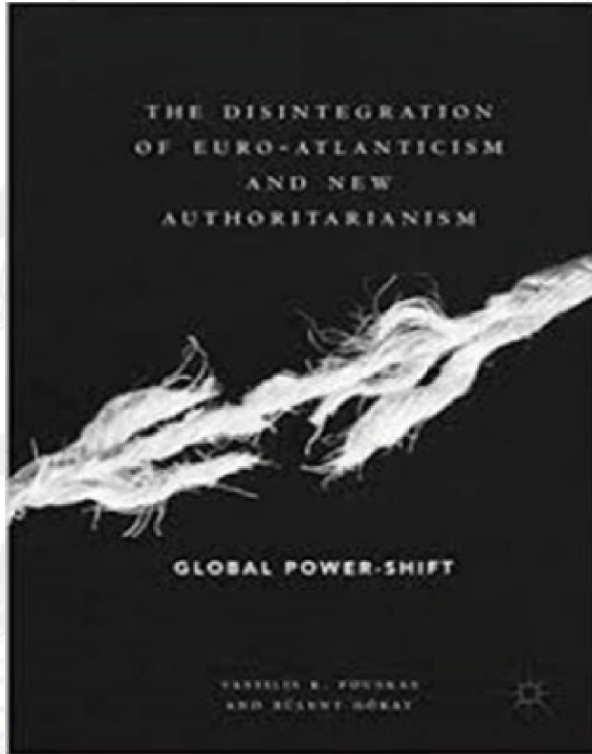




Global Power-Shift

The Disintegration of Euro-Atlanticism and New Authoritarianism

Prof Vassilis Fouskas & Prof Bülent Gökay will speak at this EMAR Seminar setting out a concrete analytical and empirical framework to understand the Eurozone crisis and the deep disintegrative tendencies of Euro-Atlantic neo- imperialism.

They will explore how authoritarianism and austerity led from above in the transatlantic world cultivate right-wing populism and racist hysteria from below, especially in relation to the global power-shift to China and other emerging economies.

Vassilis K. Fouskas & Bülent Gökay are marking over 20 years of collaborative research with the publication of *Global Power-Shift: The Disintegration of Euro - Atlanticism and New Authoritarianism* (Palgrave - Macmillan, November 2018), their third co-authored book. They argue that ordoliberal / neo-liberal austerity cannot reverse the decline of western economies; if anything, it precipitates their downfall and the re-launching of globalization under Asian primacy.

Prof. Vassilis K. Fouskas is teaching International Politics & Economics at the Royal Docks School of Business & Law, University of East London. He read history, politics and economics at the Universities of Athens, Perugia and London. Vassilis is the founding editor of the refereed periodical *Journal of Balkan and Near Eastern Studies* (Routledge/Taylor & Francis). At UEL, he leads the Centre for the Study of States, Markets & People (STAMP) and supervises PhD students in the fields of political economy and international history/relations.

Prof. Bülent Gökay joined Keele University in 1996 from Wolfson College, Cambridge, where he had been a postdoctoral Research Fellow. He worked at the Birkbeck College-London, University of North London, and at the University of Cambridge, teaching the history of Soviet Union, Russian Revolution, Weimar Republic, Eastern Europe and the Balkans, Intelligence and International Politics. He is the founder and the Managing Editor of the *Journal of Global Fault lines*, now published by Pluto Press.
