How can these conditions be understood in terms of their internal relationship so as to capture capital's connection to the states-system of uneven and combined development, social reproduction, and the contradictions facing humanity within world-ecology?

In this presentation, he will first outline the importance of the philosophy of internal relations and the way this relates to a historical materialist understanding of the relations between agency and structure as well as ideology and material structure. In a second step, he will then discuss the Eurozone crisis with an emphasis on the underpinning capitalist structuring conditions and the class struggle over its resolution.

He runs the blog on trade unions and global restructuring, providing analytical commentary on labour movements and their attempts to resist exploitation in today's neo-liberal, global capitalism.
